I'm Emily Luttrull, an undergraduate student at Scripps College in Claremont. This summer, I was blessed to receive a grant from my school to work with Pomona Hope as an intern. I spent ten weeks working alongside Emily Peine and others to put together a Summer Reading Program for the community's kids. We administered reading assessments at the beginning of the program to group the students by ability and worked on skills based on state standards throughout the summer. During the last week, we retested everyone and found that over 90% of the students significantly improved. However, as I'm sure is always the case, I received much more from this summer than I gave.

God's provision was incredible. One of my fears was that nobody would even show up after we'd

spent so much time planning the program – during the first week alone, almost forty kids showed up and we had to create a waiting list. There was one day of the program where we didn't have enough food for snack (we ran through it pretty fast with so many students!). I wasn't sure what to do, but didn't have to worry long because Coco George coincidentally showed up with groceries a day early and Lisa Drake dropped off a box of fruit just before the program began. There are countless other stories of God's strong and clear support for what Pomona Hope is doing in its community.

One of the most significant experiences of the summer was our final Open House celebration. We invited the parents and families (again, many more attended than I was expecting) to watch the
