





**Pomona Hope** is a community-driven, faith-based non-profit, whose local partnerships and holistic programs cultivate meaningful relationships and empower people of all backgrounds, particularly at-risk youth and their families, to work together toward personal and community transformation.



## Our programs (2022-2023)

- After School with Pomona Hope (ASPH) + Summer Enrichment with Pomona Hope (SEPH)
- Youth and Young Adult Development
- Padres Fuertes Hacen Familias Fuertes (Strong Parents Make Strong Families)
- Center Street Community Garden (weekly student workshops and exploration)

## Our students

- 89 K-12 students from 57 families participated in after school or summer enrichment programs
- 60% Latinx, 14% Asian/Asian-American, 10% Black or African-American, 9% White, 7% Multi-racial
- 70% of Pomona Hope families earn \$40,000 or less annually
- 100% of students qualify for free/reduced lunch

## Our impact

- 73% of junior high and high school students reported a B-average or higher
- The majority of elementary-aged students meet or exceed grade-level standards in reading, writing, math
- 528 hours over 159 days of no-cost K-12 programs including daily homework time and extracurricular workshops
